

Call for seminar participants

Tales from Planet Earth

9-12 April, 2014

Location: Filmhuset and Nobelmuseum, Stockholm

Tales from Planet Earth is an environmentally-themed Film Festival and Conference which combines public outreach, film-making and research.

Using film screenings as a focus for discussion and workshops, we want to raise issues concerning the role of narrative in science communication, film as a means of both spreading and creating knowledge, and the intersections between research, film making, policy making, and activism. Organized around the themes of Waste, Energy, the Circumpolar North and Environmental Justice, the festival will combine film screenings in the evenings with workshops, lectures and discussion panels during the afternoons.

This is a call for participants for the three seminars/workshops that will be organized in the afternoons of the 10, 11 and 12 April, ca 1300-1600. The seminars will take the forms of panels where invited speakers will use film clips to start a discussion around the different themes.

Seminar themes:

10 April: Fact and fiction: The construction of documentaries and fiction as documents. Film-makers, environmental historians and Science and Technology Studies researchers all grapple with issues of what constitutes fact or fiction, and where the line between them can be drawn. This seminar will bring together participants from these different fields to share their experiences and discuss the fact/fiction relationship.

11 April: Visualizing the environmental humanities: Using film in research, education and museums.

Film is becoming more frequently used as a tool and material for research about the environment, as well as a means of provoking thought in students – and allowing them to present their own work. How can we develop these uses, and what are the promises and pitfalls of using film in research and education?

12 April: *Making a difference? Film, research, policy and activism.*

Engaging in environmental research as well as film-making often springs from a wish to influence policy and instigate social change. However, how can this happen in practice? Which new issues arise when we blur the lines between research, documentary film-making, policy and activism?
