Intended learning outcomes

To understand the forces in team development both for projects teams as well as ordinary teams in an organisation aiming at implementing changes

Course contents

Group training and activity based learning about how a team develops and how to handle conflicts in the team. Finding ways to discover the full potential of the group.

Disposition

The course is given in English during daytime and is of half time study. The participants will learn from activity based learning about the development of project teams and change teams.

Examination
